### **Becoming a Town Council Candidate**

Pursuant to <u>Section 3.03</u> of the Town Charter, Town **general elections** are held on the 2nd Tuesday in March. All elected officials serve a two year term. Two Council Members and the Mayor are elected in each odd-numbered year and three Council Members are elected in each even-numbered year.

All registered voters of the Town of Palm Beach who have resided in the Town for a period of at least one (1) year prior to qualifying for the Election are eligible to run for the Town of Palm Beach Town Council.
