The failure of our neighborhood to be timely apprised of this request resulted in a belated opposition from the neighborhood. This is not right or fair. Why should we be coming into this matter in the 7th inning? Our neighborhood is totally united in its opposition which should be evident by the letter sent this past week. Our position should not be compromised by having not been in a position to express our opposition when this initially was presented to the Town.

Based upon this situation, I hope that you would consider a modification to the rules on who receives notice based upon its impact. Thanks.
