Mayor Coniglio introduced Harrison Fisher, a fourteen year-old student from the Palm Beach Day Academy who was chosen by his school to be Mayor for the day in Palm Beach. Mr. Fisher spoke regarding the need for improved school safety and stricter gun laws in light of the recent school shootings that occurred at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School.

Mayor Coniglio expressed her gratitude to Harrison Fisher and spoke in support of his efforts to keep schools safe. She also thanked the community for their involvement in signing the petitions to protect the Town's home rule. She spoke regarding recent bills that failed such as the ones pertaining to vacation rentals, permit fees, tree trimming and vegetation regulations, and municipal election dates.

#### 41 X. COMMENTS OF TOWN COUNCIL MEMBERS AND TOWN MANAGER

President Moore welcomed Mr. Crampton and thanked the Town Council for their support as she assumes her new role as President. She stressed the importance of the Town Council working as a team..

Council Member Araskog thanked Mayor Coniglio for all of her efforts in raising awareness of the home rule issues. She thanked Richard Kleid for his service and welcomed new Council Member Lew Crampton. She remarked on how fortunate the

Council is to work with qualified board and commission members. She requested that a discussion beadded under Any Other Matters regarding the Council Committee appointments. She reminded the community about the County's dog leash law. She also congratulated President Moore and President Pro Tem Zeidman on their new positions.

President Moore added to Ms. Araskog's comment about the dog leash law and the Town's Code of Ordinances relative to picking up animal droppings. She also stated that it is a health issue and a public nuisance.

Council Member Crampton thanked all the voters and stated his goals during his tenure, which are to ensure the town operates productively and to shine a light on the Town's finances. He also praised the ARCOM and Landmarks Preservation Commission applicants for their willingness to serve and remarked on their excellent qualifications.

Council Member Lindsay welcomed Council Member Crampton and shared a recent incident regarding a dog attack. She echoed the comments of President Moore regarding the importance of people picking up after their dogs, especially on the Town's beaches. She applauded the Mayor on her efforts with handling the assault on home rule by the legislature.

Council President Pro Tem Zeidman commented on her tenure with the Council and that she looks forward to serving as the President Pro Tem.

Town Manager Blouin commented on the second amendment and the need to change legislation. He also announced the results of the appointments to the ARCOM and Landmarks Preservation Commission.

Town Attorney Randolph spoke regarding a pending lawsuit against the City of Coral Gables who recently passed a similar Ordinance banning single use plastic bags. He reported that the Florida Retail Federation filed an injunctive relief declaring the Ordinance unconstitutional. He recommended that the Town await the decision of the Third Court of Appeal before making any decision regarding adopting the Ordinance.

It was the consensus of the Town Council to take no action until the legal matter with Coral Gables is resolved.
