




#### Original Bingham Island Sketch


#### **Restoration Goals**

**Return** Florida's threatened wading birds to their home in the Lake Worth Lagoon




#### **Program Activities**



**Remove** invasive species & dead trees


**Replant** with locally-sourced Florida native plants & tree







