We are residents of 262 Park Avenue, Palm Beach. Barbara moved to Palm Beach in 1953 when she was 8 years old, grew up in Palm Beach, and for several years lived on Sunset Avenue. We lived for many years away from Palm Beach and when we retired were able to return.

This is our home and we are indeed complaining that our street is being made into a garbage dump and we are being subjected to an unsightly blight by persons who don't want to manage their own garbage.

Park Avenue is a street of predominantly single family homes and with new construction of single family homes.
