Town Council Members, I write in opposition to the proposal to be reviewed tomorrow at your Development Review to allow three garages and curb cuts on the Seaview Ave. side of the John Volk home to be restored at 206 Phipps Plaza.

Seaview Ave. is probably the busiest pedestrian street in our town and the south side (Due to the shade of the buildings) of the street is used by most parents, children going to and from the two schools and other residents going to the Mandel Rec Center. Allowing three new garages and curb cuts is a pubic safety hazard of the first order.
