RE: Resolution approving the consolidation of Resolution No. 084-2021 and Resolution No. 113-2021 to Aegion/Insituform Technologies, LLC for lining of sewer pipes from the National Cooperative, BuyBoard in the amount of \$1,868,864.50 and establish a project budget of \$2,090,494; **Resolution No. 142-2021**

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Town staff recommends that Town Council approve the consolidation of Resolution No. 084-2021 and Resolution No. 113-2021 to Aegion/Insituform Technologies, LLC for lining of sewer pipes from the National Cooperative, BuyBoard in the amount of \$1,868,864.50 and establish a project budget of \$2,090,494.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Town Council approved Resolution No. 084-2021 in an amount of \$442,974.50 and established a project budget of \$448,721 on August 10th. In addition Town Council approved Resolution No. 113-2021 in the amount of \$1,425,890 and established a project budget of \$1,641,773 on September 14th.

Town Staff is ready to issue task orders to Aegion/Insituform Technologies, LLC to begin the actual lining of the sewer pipes. To effectively administer the overall project, it has been determined that the consolidation of the previously approved resolutions into one document would be a more efficient way to proceed.

Staff is not requesting additional funding.

PROCUREMENT METHODOLOGY

Town Purchasing accessed a National Cooperative Contract to secure the requested services. The vendor, AEGION/Insituform Technologies LLC is a recognized contractor to provide this service and has outstanding references.

FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT

As previously noted, Town staff is only requesting the consolidation of the two previously awarded resolutions. No additional funding is required for this consolidation request.

For the two previous resolutions, it was noted that funding for the awards would be from the Capital Improvement Program. The Town intends to use funds for the Slip Lining from the American Rescue Action Act. The Slip Lining was identified for this program.

PUBLIC WORKS REVIEW

This item has been reviewed by the Public Works and approved as recommended.
