Dear Town Council:

I am writing to express my strong support for the important safety enhancements requested by The Breakers to be undertaken during the Town electrical undergrounding project along South County Road, specifically:

- The installation of a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon System (PHB) at the Via Bethesda cross walk;
- an adjustment to the traffic signal on Royal Poinciana Way for vehicles traveling east and turning south onto South County Road by adding a "No Turn on Red" warning whenever the golf cart crossing /pedestrian cross walk is active; and
- enhancement of all cross walk visibility with high definition materials.

The dynamics of the Via Bethesda cross walk and increases in pedestrian, golf cart and vehicle traffic in Palm Beach require additional safety measures. The current pedestrian activated flashing light has proven to be ineffective for the following reasons:

- Vehicles often do not yield at all at the cross walk, indicating that it does not have sufficient visibility even with the on-demand flashing lights on the side of the road;
- With four lanes of traffic, a yielding vehicle often blocks the view of the pedestrian or golf cart in the cross walk for a subsequent approaching vehicle, putting the pedestrian at serious risk of being hit by the second vehicle;
- Church parking in the outside traffic lanes on South County Road also blocks the view of pedestrians and golf carts entering the cross walk for approaching vehicles, creating a serious risk of being hit by vehicles traveling in the inside lanes;
- Increased speed limit from 25 to 30 mph in this stretch resulting in faster vehicle speed enhancing all of the risks above.

In order to address these serious safety exposures, I agree with The Breakers' request for a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon System (PHB) at the Via Bethesda cross walk. This type of crossing signal extends over the road, and has an on-demand red light which, when activated, will clearly indicate the cross walk is in use to all approaching vehicles, and that a full stop is required. This light will only be activated on demand when pedestrians or golf carts are entering the cross-walk. As a citizen of Palm Beach who regularly uses this cross walk, I feel strongly that this type of crossing signal is required to address the existing serious safety issues.

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

I am writing to express my strong feeling to avoid and deny the request by The Breakers to be undertaken during the Town electrical undergrounding project along South County Road, specifically:

The dynamics of the Via Bethesda cross walk does not require additional safety measures. The current pedestrian activated flashing light has proven to be a warning to motorists that golfers would like to cross the road. A red light stopping all traffic is not indicated for motorists that golfers wish to cross the road. The street is painted with white stripes indicating a crosswalk. This is successful in cities and towns across the world. It can continue to be successful here in Palm Beach.

As a longtime resident of the Town of Palm Beach, it has been my experience that motorists are able to stop for pedestrians and golfers on carts. Adding more red lights and difficulties trying to move through town will only complicate driving and possibly cause injuries.

I am hopeful that the Town Council appreciates the need to allow motorists to continue to share the road with golf carts, bicycles and pedestrians without need and expense of an additional crossing signal at Via Bethesda, a "no turn on red" warning travelling east on the intersection of Royal Poinciana Way and South County Road. The crosswalks in our town are well marked and do not require further embellishment and expense. I enthusiastically request that you deny all requests and allow citizens to move freely without further unnecessary regulations on our roads.
