What hours will the teachers be allowed to access the lot? 6 AM to 6PM....
The "Quality of Life" for those residences who abut the school property will surely be impacted by noise, lights, etc and security concerns

Will the school bus also park here?

What assurance is there of no other use of this lot except school employees?

Who will monitor the lot to be sure there is no abuse .....

IF this parking is allowed will be a magnet for use as soon as it is known there is "PARKING LOT" on Seaview...the word will surely spread throughout the Island....
Parking for the Rec Center, The 4 Arts, the public School, and County Road businesses should have need a consideration at the time they are approved....

It is not fair for the Seaspray homeowners to give up their QUALITY as a solution for parking on Seaview.
