FYI - This Memo is provided as Information to the Town Council

As you know, the Town has a "Three Strike Rule" for construction parking and construction site management. The regulations and process are found in the Town's "Department of Public Works, Engineering Division, Standards Applicable to Public Rights-of-Way and Easements Within the Town of Palm Beach" (commonly called the Right-of Way-Manual), dated May 1994, as revised through January 12, 2022. Chapter XII, Miscellaneous Provisions, contains the details of the Three Strike rules. The regulations spell out the process in which contractors can secure parking permits, the fees for various violations, and the process that must occur once a contractor receives Three Strikes – three different sets of tickets for construction violations. The applicable pages of the Right of Way Manual are attached.

1540 S. Ocean Blvd. recently reached the level of Three Strikes for construction violations. The contractor is Seagate Capital Construction. The first violation occurred on March 29, 2022 for right of way work without a permit and inadequate maintenance of traffic, issued by Public Works. The second violation occurred on October 19, 2022 for violation of construction hours, issued by Code Enforcement. The third violation occurred on October 24, 2022 for right of way work without a permit and inadequate maintenance of traffic, issued by Police. Copies of all violations are attached. The Pending Stop Work Order Notice (attached) was sent to the contractor October 26, 2022.

The regulations allow a time frame for the violator to appeal the ticket(s). In this case, since the last violation was issued by Police, the appeal was filed to Chief Nicholas Caristo. The regulations required Chief Caristo to hear / review the appeal (if filed) and render a ruling. Chief Caristo found in favor of the Town, and therefore upheld the Third Strike. This decision occurred on October 31, 2022. The Planning, Zoning & Building Department issued a STOP WORK ORDER for the construction project on November 2, 2022.

The contractor owes the Town \$1,050.00 in fines and fees, at this time.

The Town Council's process for this matter is contained within the Public Works "Right of Way Manual", as follows:

"When the Town Council receives a written request to lift a stop work order the Town Council shall have the power to admonish the contractor; take such action as deemed necessary to effect the stop work order on a permanent basis by nullifying the existing building permit; cause the contractor and/or property owner to enter into a binding agreement to memorialize the understandings between the Town and the contractor and/or property owner relative to all conditions placed upon the lifting of the stop work order, if applicable; establish penalties for future right-of-way violations the amount for which shall be in the sole discretion of the Town Council; collect the "3 strike" fine, plus payment of any outstanding right-of-way fines and accumulated interest, as referenced herein below and to prohibit the issuance of any additional right-of way permits for the duration of the work in question.

The fine for a third (3rd) and each subsequent strike shall be \$500 plus payment of any outstanding right of-way fines and accumulated interest unless the Town Council chooses to invoke the use of a binding agreement memorializing a penalty structure to be paid to the Town for all future right-of-way violations in excess of three (3) to be paid in accordance with the terms and conditions of the binding agreement between the Town and the contractor and/or property owner. All fines and penalties shall be paid in full prior to issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy for the construction associated with the activity that generated the fines, penalties, and interest."

Any motion to resolve this matter should include "waiving the third strike" and "granting the ability for the contractor to apply for future right of way permits".





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

Re: **STOP WORK ORDER PENDING** 3-Strike Rule Citations – 1540 S Ocean Blvd, B-21-91998

As you know, the Town of Palm Beach <u>Standards Applicable To Public Rights-Of-Way And</u> <u>Easements Within The Town Of Palm Beach</u> regulates the number of construction-related vehicles that can be parked on Town streets in conjunction with building project sites within the Town. Attached to all construction permits issued to a job is information regarding these regulations.

This letter is to serve as notice that on **THREE** separate occasions you have received parking citations: Strike 3 October 24, 2022 (PD 01454 Working in right-of-way without permit, Inadequate Maintenance of Traffic) Strike 2 October 19, 2022 (PD-01452 – Construction Hours)

Strike 1 March 29, 2022 (PW-6377 –Failure to have permit on job, Inadequate Maintenance of Traffic, Failure to carry-out permit terms/conditions)

Therefore, under the Town's rules (referred to as the "3-strike" rule), the Director of Public Works has notified the Planning, Zoning & Building Department of these violations, and requested that a **"Stop Work"** order be issued as allowed by Section 18-204 of Town Code.

Per Town Resolution No 001-2022, because you have received these strikes, a fine in the amount of \$500.00 is being imposed and is also payable immediate to the Town of Palm Beach. This fine is <u>in addition</u> to all right-of-way fines referenced above. Invoice # 81136 is attached.

An appeal to the Police Chief needs to be submitted in writing no later than October 31, 2022 (within 7 days). If an appeal is denied or is not filed in a timely fashion, a "Stop Work" order will be issued by the Building Official effective the end of the working day October 31, 2022. After that date, no work may be performed at the site under any permits issued by the Town of Palm Beach.

All requests to lift a "**Stop Work**" order would need to be decided by the Town Council. The next Town Council meeting date is Tuesday, November 8, 2022. In order for this item to be

considered at that meeting, you would need to submit a written request to me no later than Wednesday, November 2, 2022, prior to 5:00 PM.

Chief Caristo,

Our company is the General Contractor for a new home construction project located at 1540 S Ocean Blvd. I am writing to you to respectfully appeal the citation letter that we received on October 26, 2022. This citation was issued as a result of the site contractor sending a grappling truck to pickup debris on the East side of our property. My superintendent had previously notified the site contractor that we had room inside our property for their truck to park and then reach over our construction fence so the debris could be picked up from within our property rather than from the outside street. I checked the permit record and we have pulled 24 Right of Way permits during this project so we are familiar with the requirement and procedure for Right of Way permits and would have pulled the permit if necessary. Unfortunately the site contractor did not convey the information about parking inside our property to the driver who proceeded to pull up on the outside of the road to collect the debris. My superintendent was onsite during this time but at the opposite end of the property and therefore unaware that the truck was out front. As soon as my superintendent was notified that the site contractor driver was out front he immediately asked him to leave and reminded him that he needed a ROW permit for any activity in the road. I apologize for this violation as we are aware of the requirement for ROW permits and properly notified our site contractor if one was required. I'm respectfully asking for you to grant an appeal of this citation. Thank you for your consideration.
