STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Town Council approve Resolution No. 009-2025 approving an award to Coastal Protection Engineering, LLC in a Not-To-Exceed amount of \$208,230 for professional services to conduct surveys for queen conch within borrow areas NBA1, NBA2, and NBA.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION/BACKGROUND

Coastal Protection Engineering, LLC (CPE) was awarded as a prequalified engineering firm for Coastal Engineering Services by Resolution No. 05-2020 on February 11, 2020. The request by the Town to provide professional survey services follows under the scope of this contract.

Over the last year, the US Fish and Wildlife Service has listed the Queen Conch as a threatened species under the Endangered Species Act. Unfortunately, this was premature because the requirements for identifying and mitigating for the queen conch have not been clearly defined. Subsequently, the Corps of Engineers has faced potential delays in federal projects that include dredging and filling in areas that might be Queen Conch habitat. A Queen Conch survey for the borrow sites for the Federally authorized Mid-Town project is required. To expedite the process and avoid any additional delays in the Mid-Town Beach Nourishment project, Town staff is proposing this work be completed by Coastal Protection Engineering immediately.

FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this service will be from the Coastal Program.
